The following report details the results of your Business Analysis Knowledge Assess test. The assessment included 120 multiple choice knowledge test questions based on the International Institute of Business Analysis Body of Knowledge Version 1.6 (BABoK). This report is designed to offer you guidance on what development you should consider when planning your business analysis development. The questions in the examination are designed to assist you in learning formal business analysis terminology and concepts as defined in the BABoK.

Your average score across all questions is 24%. The pass mark for the IIBA CBAP is not publicly available. The BA Knowledge Assess uses a target score of 80% as the basis for the gap analysis of suggested development.

If your score is well below the target score of 80% you will be recommended to complete reading and training. If your score is only marginally lower than the target score of 80% you will be recommended to complete reading only. If your score is equal to or greater than 80% you will be recommended as having "No Gap".

To assist with targeting your reading sections of the BABoK are suggested based on the questions you did not answer correctly. The precise questions you answered incorrectly are not provided.
